



OFFICIAL VOTING INFORMATION
COUNTY OF BOTETOURT RESIDENTS
June 13, 2017 Primary Election



Deadline to Register to Vote in the June 13, 2017 Primary Election is Monday, May 22, 2017 @ 5:00 pm. The Botetourt County Department of Elections & Voter Registration will be open until 5:00 pm on May 22, 2017 for the purpose of registering qualified persons. Individuals who will be 18-years of age on or before November 7, 2017 General Election are eligible to register to vote and participate in the June 13, 2017 Primary Election. See note below.

CHANGE OF NAME OR ADDRESS: If you are currently a registered voter and have had a **change to your name or address**, you must notify the Registrar in writing or appear in person in the Department of Elections & Voter Registration to update the information.

****Notifying the Post Office does NOT change your Voter Registration information****

ABSENTEE VOTERS: For the convenience of registered voters who need to vote by **absentee ballot**, the Voter Registration Office will be open from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm on **Saturday, June 10, 2017 for in-person absentee voting.**

INTERESTED IN PARTICIPATING: Elections would not be possible without the participation of voters as election officials. These officials carry out important duties at each polling place to ensure the election is done efficiently and with integrity. We are looking for voters who would be interested in becoming election officials for upcoming elections. Come be a part of the election in November 2017 while enjoying comradery with fellow Botetourt County citizens. A stipend is paid based on participation. Please contact our office for more information.

POTENTIAL VOTERS WHO WILL BE 18 ON OR BEFORE November 7, 2017: If you will be 18 years of age on or before November 7, 2017 you are eligible to register to vote prior to the stated deadlines and participate in the June 13, 2017 Primary Election pertaining to the November 7, 2017 General Election. Registrations can be submitted online, via mail or in-person prior to the deadlines. Please contact our office should you have questions.
